It seems to be in our nature to be dissatisfied and always on the hunt for what is bigger, better (easier), brighter, and more beautiful.

- ✓ Paul knew what it was to be misunderstood (7-15)
- ✓ Paul knew what it was to be misrepresented (16-21a)
- ✓ Paul knew what it was to be mistreated (21b-33)

We could all say that Paul had reasons to give up on the Corinthians and ministry. But God had called him, and he loved them, and he refused to quit on them or on ministry.

Satan finds satisfaction in our dissatisfaction if it leads to our unfaithfulness.

 - 3. Allow someone to care.

- We can use our satisfaction and our faithfulness against Satan.
